

She earned her MFA at the University of Iowa, but lived most of her life in the South, where she became an anomaly among posta World War II authors--a Roman Catholic woman whose stated purpose was to reveal the mystery of God's grace in everyday life. Her work--novels, short stories, letters, and criticism--received a number of awards, including the National Book Award."

FLANNERY O'CONNOR was born in Savannah, Georgia, in 1925. She was awarded the Best of the

National Book Awards for Fiction in 2009 and was the first fiction writer born in the twentieth century to have her works collected and published by the Library of America. When she died at the age of thirty-nine, America lost one of its most gifted writers at the height of her powers. She was particularly acclaimed for her stories, which combined the comic with the tragic and grotesque. Her body of work was small, consisting of only thirty-one stories, two novels, and some speeches and letters.
